Lesson Plan: How to Celebrate the 800th Anniversary of the Mongol Empire

Classes and Grade Levels: This lesson is appropriate for junior high with geography, English, Communications or Learning Strategies Classes.

Goals and Objectives: Take the information obtained from various readings and online videos of primary sources and create a poster for oral presentation. The purpose is to allow students to connect history with the current day, while incorporating geographical, biographical, and historical information into their oral presentations,

Curriculum Standards Addressed:

<u>Geography</u> - Benchmark 2 - Regions: The student analyzes the spatial organization of people, places and environments that form regions on Earth's surfaces.

Time Required: There should be a total of 3 class periods; one for introduction to lesson and research; one for working on the poster and a 3rd day to present the poster.

Compare the celebration of the 1st anniversary of the Mongol Empire with a celebration of the 800th. How is modern Mongolia different than ancient Mongolia? Where would the celebration take place? What are they celebrating? What would the celebration look like? What food and drink would they serve? What activities would be available at the celebration?

Research the Mongol Empire using the following lessons as your guide. Your final product will be a poster presentation comparing the two celebrations.

Mongolia is approximately the size of which state?
Mongolia is surrounded by what two countries? and
IN the southern part of Mongolia there is the desert.
In what century did Chinggis (Genghis) Khan unify his empire?
What similar task did Genghis Kahn's grandson do?
Part II - How did the Mongols live and die? What animal helped create major change in the art of war? What role does this animal play today?
